BBPP & Steward Funding Formula Review for 2007 Background Briefing Note for February 14 Consultation

Introduction

This briefing note provides information regarding the preliminary recommendations of the Steering Committee for the Blue Box Program Plan (BBPP) and Stewards' Funding Formula Review for 2007. Further detail on the proposed changes will be provided by the Steering Committee (SC) at a public meeting to be held at the Novotel Hotel Toronto Centre (45 The Esplanade; Champagne Ballroom, 2nd floor) on February 14. The Steering Committee has developed these recommendations following evaluation of the input received from stakeholders during the course of the review.

This briefing note summarizes:

The Process to Date and Input Received

The objectives of the funding formula review are to provide an opportunity for all stakeholders to:

- Re-evaluate the current funding formula, and
- Identify and assess potential modifications or alternative approaches, prior to setting stewards' fees for the 2007 program year.

The Steering Committee committed to consider modifications to the BBPP fee setting methodology through an open, comprehensive, fair and transparent process. This has included the following key steps:

Following the February 14 public meeting, the following steps must be completed to amend the BBPP:

- Steering Committee review of comments received and modifications as required March 3
- Review for comment of final Steering Committee recommendations by Advisory Com. March 6

- Review and approval by Stewardship Ontario Board of Directors
- Submission of revised BBPP to Waste Diversion Ontario (WDO) Board of Directors
 March 15 for March 22 meeting
- WDO submission of revised BBPP to Minister of the Environment
 Follows WDO approval

Comments received to date have been reviewed and evaluated by the Steering Committee according to the following screening criteria:

- Complies with the legal requirements of the Waste Diversion Act (WDA)
- Furthers the policies and goals of the WDA and BBPP
- Would result in a material impact that warrants making a change
- Treats stewards and materials in a fairer manner
- Strengthens incentives for 3Rs
- Improves simplicity and transparency of the funding formula
- Facilitates compliance and auditing
- Has a proponent, and
- Sufficient outline of proposed approach and available data to allow for effective modeling of the impact on fees.

A <u>summary of the comments</u> received since the December 8 public meeting is posted on the Stewardship Ontario website.

Results of January 31, 2006 Stewardship Ontario Board Review:

Based on the input received and the analysis undertaken by the Steering Committee, the following outlines the general recommendations and decisions that have been taken by the Board for setting stewards fees for 2007:

- Improve the accuracy of material-specific net costs calculation by changing the way in which revenue and material prices are calculated.
- Simplify the Recovery Rate factor calculation by replacing the current statistical calculation with a simplified calculation based on the relative recovery of each material type.
- Provide an opportunity for a recycled-content credit program to be incorporated into subsequent annual fee setting calculations within the existing market development component of the fee setting formula. Stewards within material sectors would submit detailed plans for such programs for Stewardship Ontario approval.
- Maintain the structure of the current three factor funding formula but revise the factor weightings to shift more of the financial obligation from materials with high recovery rates to those with low recovery rates to;
 - promote reaching the 60% diversion target for Blue Box Wastes at the lowest total cost
 - while sharing the cost more equitably among all materials.

- For the purposes of fee setting, aggregate materials with similar recycling characteristics (handling, revenue, data accuracy, etc.):
 - looking for the right balance between competing issues for example:
 - recognizing that no single solution will address all issues and satisfy all concerns.
- Leave de minimis level as it is.
- Do not give an exemption or credit for biodegradability.
- Leave allocation of Stewardship Ontario common costs as it is.
- Continue to calculate Blue Box Waste generation rates using waste audit data crosschecked against steward data, and
- Focus further stakeholder consultation on the proposed revisions to the three factors in the model and further aggregation/dis-aggregation of material types for the purposes of fee setting.

Following on from these decisions, the Steering Committee will be presenting on February 14:

- A revised formula with the Steering Committees preferred weightings for the recovery rate, net cost and equalization factors, and proposed combinations of materials for aggregation and dis-aggregation for the purposes of 2007 fee setting.
- How these recommendations are intended to improve the current funding formula.
- The effects of the recommended changes on allocating BBPP costs across material types.
- A range of alternative factor weightings and possible aggregation scenarios and how these would affect fee rates, and
- Other options that could be considered for mitigating the effects of changes on the funding formula on future fee rates.

Objective of the February 14 Meeting

The Steering Committee will be seeking input from stakeholders on the proposed revisions to the funding formula, including requesting responses to a series of questions focused on the specific aspects of the recommended changes.
