Fee Rates - Process

Budget

- Supply Chain Management cost
 - + Program Management cost

Material Cost Input New: Material Cost Index (MCI)

Fees

 Allocates the program budget to each material category using the Four-Step Fee Methodology, creating the total fees to be paid by each material category

Fee Rates

 Divides the total material category fees by the total quantity supplied by stewards in that category to produce a fee rate expressed in cents/kg









Material Cost Index

- Phased introduction of MCI completed last year
- Used as an input to Step 1 of the Four-Step Fee Methodology to allocate Gross Costs.
- Better differentiation of material cost impacts on recycling system activities
- MCI updated for 2023 based on studies









Impact of MCI Update

No notable increases in MCI; materials with noteworthy decreases include:

Kraft Paper

- Examples: grocery shopping bags, sugar bags.
- Increase in density due to trend towards more use of kraft paper takeout shopping bags and kraft packaging material for shipping

Boxboard

- Examples: cereal and tissue boxes.
- Increase in cart bulk density









Disaggregation

- Aggregation formerly used to "average" fee rates for some groups of materials has been retired
- Phased integration initiated in 2022 with MCI
- Improved fairness, no impact on reporting categories



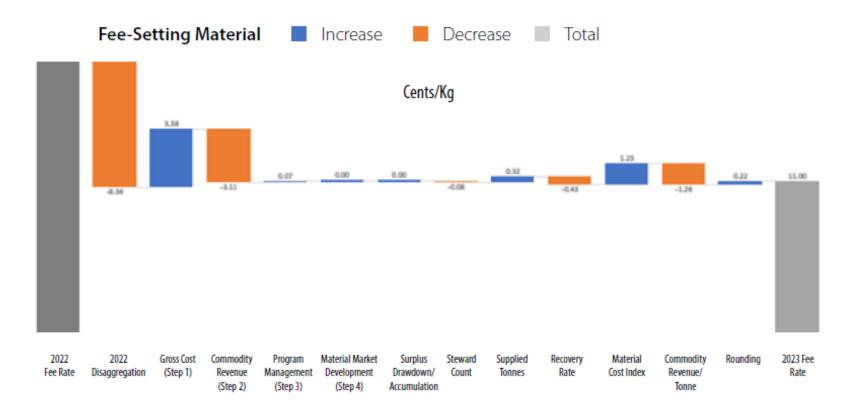






Cause of Change

- Addresses steward requests for details behind changes to annual fee rates

Impact of commodity volatility and application of surplus drawdowns



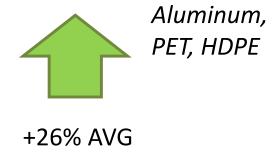

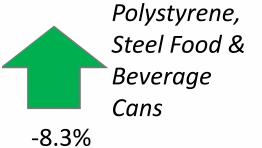

Achievements since 2021 ASM

Pivotal Year for SO



- Improved dialogue with RPRA and municipalities enabled key improvements for stewards
 - End of disputes re: determination of steward obligation
 - End of data reporting for most stewards (and associated compliance costs)
 - More stable and predictable fees for stewards through to the end of the SO program in 2025
 - Substantial savings in program management
- Confidentiality review, new policies and new MSA assure SO's independence, enabling a productive client-provider relationship with RRA (Now CM)

Other Highlights



- Expanded access to data on program recovery
- Streamlined Annual Report
- Launched a redeveloped SO website that is more user-friendly to stewards and relevant to SO's transitional status
- Refocused P&E effort on tactical/local digital media to reach residents while making way for broader Producer efforts to communicate the "new world"

- Steward obligation \$19.8M or 11.7% lower vs 2022
- Program operations lower by \$1.2M or 16%
- Transition costs slightly higher by \$56K or 5%
- Required fees lower by \$9.1M or 5.5%

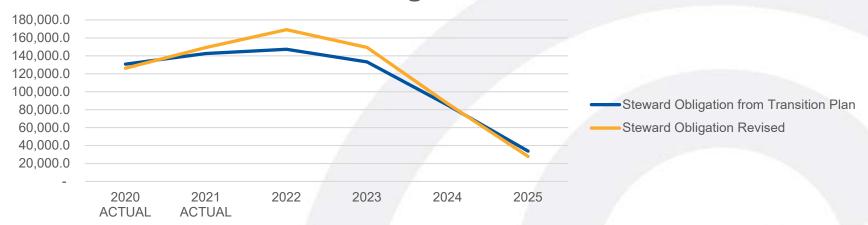


Revised Forecast of Costs Through Transition

Steward Obligation 2020-2025

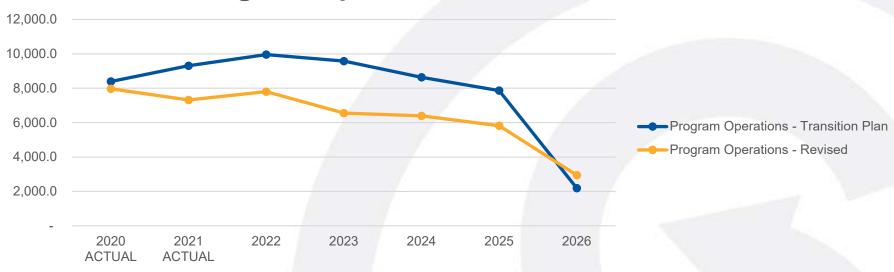


- Steward Obligation was higher than forecast in 2021-23 but we are projecting a return to the projection for 2024 and 2025
- Revised projection is ~\$34M or 5.1% higher than Transition Plan projection over the full course of the Plan (2020-2025)

Updated Transition Forecast (2)



Program Operations Costs 2020-2026



 Actual/projected operating costs are lower in almost every year of transition for a total savings of \$11.2M or 19.9%

Updated Transition Forecast (3)



Transition Costs - 2020-2026



 Actual/projected transition costs lower in every year of transition for a total savings of \$4M or 35.4%



Simplified Fees

Simplified Fees – Steward Requirements



- Steward is in good-standing
- Steward filed accurate and complete reports for both the 2020 and 2021 reporting years
- Steward filed an accurate and complete report for one of the baseline years and was exempt from reporting in the other baseline year
- Any steward-initiated adjustments to the baseline years have been reviewed and approved

Invoices for 2023



- Precise percentage shares for each steward are currently being finalised and will be available on the Portal shortly.
- These will not be materially different to what stewards can calculate from recent invoices and SO budgets for 2021 and 2022.

Estimating 2023 Fees

- Typical for stewards that filed complete reports in 2020 and 2021 (invoice year 2021 and 2022)
- Fee percentage for 2023 will be the average of the two baseline percentages
- The 2023 percentage is multiplied by the forecast for total fees to produce the estimated invoice fee
